

"Developing a Heart for God"

Mentioned a thousand times in the Bible, David is the biblical man for all seasons. David is the most complex and multi-sided human character in Scripture.

David was a shepherd, fugitive, politician, king, poet, musician, prophet, warrior, friend (the Jonathan story), lover, father, sinner (adulterer and murderer), penitent and "type" of Christ.

David is unique among biblical characters because we know him from both external narrative accounts of him and internally since he was a writer of lyric poems.

The role in which David is best known is that of boy hero and giant killer. When David kills Goliath he becomes an instant public hero, inspiring fictional heroes following in his wake from Beowulf to Jack of the Beanstalk.

To this day we read or hear about someone pulling off a "little David" act in sports or politics, or about a "David and Goliath" contest. David's success in expanding the territory of Israel was unequaled in the annals of Israelite history.

David's career as a national hero was preceded by his career as an underdog. The youngest son, belittled by his older siblings, David was considered so unlikely a candidate among Jesse's sons to be anointed as the future king that he had to be summoned from tending the sheep after the other brothers had been passed over.

Subsequently he had a career as fugitive, fleeing from the wrathful Saul, living continuously on the edge. There is even a touch of David as rebel and desperado. Jesus cited David as a precedent for disobeying the Levitical laws based on the time David ate consecrated bread to feed his hungry men.

Then there is David the political strategist. Even after he was anointed king of Judah, David had to undertake a long process of consolidating his power until he eventually became king of the entire nation.

The moments of David's character that render him most lifelike, however, appear less in his heroic moments than in his times of error and failure. These are the stories that are for the most part edited out of childhood Sunday school curriculum, such as the affair with Bathsheba and the taking of the national census.

One of the most noteworthy features of the David story is that it begins with heroic promise but becomes a story of crime and punishment. In his career, David becomes a classic case of one sin leading to another, as he

degenerates from adulterer to murderer. Although David responds to his sin by being the ideal penitent, his subsequent life is dominated by family discord and political troubles. David is a flawed figure in whom we see ourselves.

In the later phases of his life David emerges as a tortured parent. He suffers greatly because of his sons, yet curiously we never see him warning them about the evils of excessive ambition and sexual indulgence.

New Testament references to David present him both as an ancestor and as a type of Christ. David freed Israel from the terror of literal bondage to Goliath and the Philistines; Christ freed all people from spiritual bondage to Satan and death. David was a prophet and king; so was Christ. God established a covenant with David promising him an eternal kingdom which was ultimately Christ's kingdom.

All the Gospels identify Christ as the son of David; Matthew and Luke do so with complete genealogies. It seems difficult to consider a man with David's large-scale failures as a type of Christ, but as we are told in the scene of his early anointing:

"The Lord does not look at the things people look at. People look at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart." (1 Sam 16:7).

While the Old Testament records David's many achievements and his occasional failures, the Psalms reveal David's deep understanding of God's forgiveness and the joy of reconciliation with him.

So, the figure of David is a figure of hope for each of us: no matter how deep a person descends and regardless of how tragic the circumstances of life become, something can be made of life.

The David of the Psalms, surrounded by trouble and guilt, is the very example of trusting in God. As a respected leader who gave in to sexual sin and who mismanaged child rearing, David is someone whose story is reenacted in every generation.

David stands as an example to God's grace, so that even such a person can be declared "a man after God's own heart."

Growing BIG by Going small

It's never good to do life alone. We need fellowship. We need community. We need each other.

Smaller groups, like Life Groups, strengthen the church body and help deepen relationships with God and each other. Life Groups are a chance to grow in faith, fellowship, encouragement, and love with other believers, all while doing life together. These are small groups with big impacts!

Even Jesus had a small group that he did life with.

The early church can serve as a model for how small, home-based groups can function. In Acts 2:42-47, the author talks about the fellowship of believers:

"42 They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. ⁴3 Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. ⁴⁴ All the believers were together and had everything in common. ⁴⁵ They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. ⁴⁶ Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, ⁴⁷ praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved."

Jesus could have used any sort of model for his ministry that he wanted. He could have chosen to only do ministry with Sunday sermons or through programs. He could have chosen a different 12 disciples each year instead of taking time to invest in one, smaller group.

It takes time and intention to invest in a small group like Life Groups. It takes vulnerability and openness to be transformed by God in an intimate setting. Life Groups is a way to add to your spiritual walk. It is not meant to replace Sunday morning worship at Mission Covenant or replace things like youth group, women's Bible studies, or men's Bible studies. Life Groups is a way to grow big by going small.

The relationships within any small group will typically reflect four main growth stages: 1) acquaintances, 2) casual friends, 3) close friends, and then becoming 4) intimate friends. We need people in our life to fall back on for encouragement in joyful and hard seasons.

Hebrews 10:23-25, "²³ Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful. ²⁴ And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, ²⁵ not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching."

Are you craving a smaller, more intimate group of people in your life to do life with? Prayerfully consider joining Mission Covenant's newly launched Life Groups, and let's start growing together.

Fall Kickoff - For this event, we are going to bring in both Jr. and Sr. High youth for an epic night of games, crafts,

We will be going through a missions agency called Praying Pelican Missions (Hannah Peterson was a missionary through this organization). We will be looking to sign up the youth, meetings and trainings, doing fundraisers to prepare for this spring break mission trip! <u>See You at the Pole</u> - For this event, the youth will meet up around the flag pole at their school (NMS, NHS, SHS, etc...) at 7:30am to pray for their school, peers, teacher, our country, and more. I will provide donuts and hot chocolate for the youth who come to pray at NMS and NHS)

This will be a great opportunity for you to give thanks to Kaela as well as meeting Steven and celebrating God's faithfulness to camp!

<u>Worship Night</u> - Both Jr. High and Sr. High will have the opportunity to gather at youth group for a night of worship and prayer as well as testimonies. This event has been deeply impactful over the years and so if your son or daughter wants to join, the event will happen at the same time as normal youth group.

<u>Hunter's Expo</u> - This year we are working towards a great family fun event that will showcase some of the best local deer mounts, vendors, fun activities for the children, prizes, amazing food, and more! Bring your friends and family out to this great community event!


How do we manage digital tyranny?








Mission Aviation Books
