I BELIEVE

In every funeral, memorial service, graveside service or celebration of life service I officiate at, as a Pastor, I always quote John 11:25-26. Jesus said to her, “I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even through they die; and whoever lives by believing in me will never die. Do you believe this? I do this to offer the hope and the encouragement that we have in Christ Jesus at the time of death because of Jesus’ resurrection. If we believe in Him, we will never die! We will live for all eternity! The importance of this verse cannot be overstated for the truth it reveals. Its value is also vitally important because of the question it leaves the reader and listener with: “Do you believe this?” This question demands a response which is why I will often mention in end of life service homily’s: “I Do!”

Critics of the Christian faith will often argue that the only reason people believe in Christianity is because they were taught to when they were growing up. Yes, I grew up in a western culture where I was taught to believe in Jesus at a young age, and I also heard all the arguments for not believing in God. Having heard all the arguments on both sides I was more than ready to believe in God because without God in the picture it is hard to find meaning in anything in this world.

The moral dimension of humanity clearly points to the hand of an intelligent designer, God. And the obtrusiveness of evil in the world and how ineradicable it is from human nature speaks loudly of the need for a savior, for an all-powerful God to redeem. Humanities capacity to morally determine between right and wrong clearly points to God just as humanities inability to overcome human nature on their own declares a need for God.

These facts are certainly important ones for belief in God, but I must say that the resurrection of Jesus is the most compelling of all. The truth surrounding His resurrection, all the eyewitnesses to it, the fact of His empty tomb that still remains empty and what Jesus’s resurrection from the dead accomplishes for believers convinces me. In one of Jesus resurrection appearances He went to Thomas, one of the twelve and showed him His resurrected body and gave Thomas the invitation to “stop doubting and believe.”

This Easter season I am praying for all of you to believe in the resurrection of Jesus!



New In Christ

I am taking a seminary course on church history. One of the things that has stood out to me is how there is nothing new under the sun (Ecclesiastes 1:9). Yes, we do live in an age of technology and advancement unseen in prior days...but there is nothing new in the condition of the human heart. One of the stories I read about was of a time when four brothers went to war against each other to claim the throne of Rome after their father had passed away. These brothers were not content to have THEIR empire divided, so they chose to kill in order to receive THEIR kingdom. The thought of going to war against a brother is sickening, but greed and a lust for power will drive people to do crazy things. James 4:1-2 says, "What causes conflicts and quarrels among you? Don't they come from the passions at war within you? You crave what you do not have; you kill and covet, but are unable to obtain it. You quarrel and fight." James was addressing conflict that can creep into the church and the terms he uses are the language of warfare. The source of this conflict is *hēdōne* or *their cravings*. These are the very passions humans have wrestled with since the time of the fall to this day. *Evil desires are a reality for every human being, and unfortunately it can be a reality within the church. James speaks of the importance of taming the tongue and to teach and practice Godly behavior.*



All that to say, each of us deal with twisted and deformed desires because of our sinful humanity, but we are not slaves to that nature. We have been given a new nature in Christ, though we are not immune to the sins of this world, we are given power over sin. Maybe you are dealing with conflict in your family or friends, maybe hostility has grown and relationships are stressed. As you reflect on these circumstances, maybe there has been passions at war within you. Maybe you have acted in ways you never thought you would. I'd encourage you to surrender your desires, your actions from the past, and circumstances in the present to God. Ask Him for wisdom and healing. Share with Him your struggles and receive His gracious healing hand over your life as He restores you and brings life amidst brokenness.





Pastoral Search Committee Update

The Search Committee for the Associate Pastor of Worship position reached a decision to extend an offer to a candidate in the late part of December. After several weeks of discerning prayer, the candidate declined the offer. We, as a Search Committee, have sought the counsel of the Elder Board regarding how to move forward in the search process. Several options were discussed and mulled over in prayer and the decision was made to continue the pastoral search process. As we have already been meeting for just over a year and knowing that the search process could potentially extend into another year, all representatives on the Search Committee were given the opportunity to step down from their positions.

I will be stepping down from my position as Elder Board representative in order to take the next step in obedience to God's leading in my life: including seminary and participation in the Renovation Covenant Church plant. The membership will vote on my replacement and any other potential representative replacements for the Search Committee at the quarterly meeting on April 24.

Despite this change in direction for the Search Committee, we remain encouraged and assured to see God at work. God has a plan and purpose in this process; and it has been special to witness His timing, call, and ministry in people's lives through the lens of the committee.

I want to personally thank Pastor Darrell Nelson, Brian Johnson, Wanda Paulsen, Grace VanderMeiden, Marilyn Nelson, and Justin Orme for their work on this committee. And thank you to the congregation for lifting us up in prayer over the last year. Please continue to keep the Pastoral staff, Search Committee members, Worship Team, congregation, and candidates in your prayers in this next phase of the pastoral search.
