A Crafty Adversary

In Genesis 3:1 it says, “Now the serpent was more crafty than any of the wild animals The Lord God had made. He said to the woman, ‘Did God really say, you must not eat from any tree in the garden?’”

When Satan, our adversary, challenged Eve like that he was presenting a question to her, implying “was God really telling the truth?” In so doing, the evil one was framing God as a liar and himself as the bearer of Truth. God’s word was not reliable but mine (the devil’s) is absolutely trustworthy. Eve responded to the serpent in verses 2-3 - they could eat from any tree in the garden except the one in the middle for if one did, they would surely die. In verses 4-5 we read “you will not certainly die,” the serpent said to the woman. “For God knows that when you eat from it, your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil.” The devil is saying that God’s holiness, goodness and glory were all a sham, and this could only be discovered by doing what God’s word had prohibited. Do you realize that a crafty adversary is using the same tactics today? And to a lot of people, he is making more sense than God. God speaks through His word and Satan though casting doubt on God’s word.

The evil one convinces people to do what feels good, what makes sense to the individual. If lying advances a person, then go for it. If promiscuous sex feels good, by all means indulge. The devil is adept at getting people to trust in themselves more than trusting in God’s word. So, the highest authority in a person’s life is their own thoughts, their own affections, their individual rights and their wishes.

If Satan can get people to such a posture of unbelief, then people will not see God as the ultimate good in the world and as a result, people will then not be able to see sin as the ultimate evil. Do you ever wonder why people in our culture call things good that God says are evil? Why people cannot seem to discover the Truth when it is right before their eyes?

The Apostle Paul in 2 Corinthians 4:4 gives credit for this where credit is due. “The god of this age has blinded the minds of unbelievers, so that they cannot see the light of the gospel that displays the glory of Christ, who is the image of God.” The witness of scripture is clear: we face a crafty adversary!

Galatians 6:2 - Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ.


Proverbs 27:17 - As iron sharpens iron, so one person sharpens another.





Benevolence Offering Update



Gus Johnson has finished his internship abroad and he will speak at the next Moment for Missions. Thank you for your support both financially as well as covering him and his family in prayer during this time.

Max Lemp with InterVarsity is going to England for 20 months to work with InterVarsity Link! He has asked us to continue to support the local campuses in the time that he is gone. We will also support him with a one time gift as he makes this temporary change! On another note, I recently had an opportunity to meet with a very nice nurse in Duluth. Turns out she is a new Christian through InterVarsity. Now she works at St. Mary's and is known as a resource for anyone on the floor who has questions about religion. To see the fruits of what we support - IN THE WILD - was a blessing to me and I hope it is to you as well!

Julio Isazza will be enrolling in a doctoral program at Oxford.

Pini from Jitokeze in Kenya was supposed to be in the US from mid-May through November and we had hoped to bring her up here for a visit, but there has been a holdup with getting her visa and her arrival in the US should be soon.

Head of the Lakes Youth for Christ has been trying to sell the Encounter building as it has become a big financial and administrative drain for them. They have an offer on the building. They are planning on using the money and freedom from the building to refocus on their school-based programs. This will allow them to reach a larger and more diverse range of youth.

This summer has been full of travel and thoughts of the future. On the future front, Cheryl decided to return to the classroom for the time being. Retirement is looking good, but she still enjoys her students, so she decided to play it by ear. Meanwhile, we drove to Kansas City for the Covenant Annual Meeting, to North Carolina to camp, and tomorrow we head to the West Coast. While there, I'll spend time talking about the future with my parents who'll soon be 93.

On my end, I have proposed a change in my ministry focus. Originally, my primary responsibility was to walk alongside those traveling between America and Congo. Because of COVID and other changes, travel has taken less time, freeing me to work directly with CEUM leaders.

One of my areas of ministry has been to accompany those leaders as they guide the church and adapt to a changing world. Another area has been to develop a ministry of listening and presence. Many people in the CEUM have never seen an American Covenanter, and my presence has encouraged them in ways I don't fully understand. My goal is to visit all 46 regions of the CEUM - and then to visit them again. I want to get to know both clergy and laity, encouraging them simply by my presence. Here is the challenge: I need your help to make this shift in ministry work. (1) Please pray that my vision is clear. (2) Please contact me if you know of a potential funding source. At up to \$6 per mile, my travel will be expensive. (3) Please be on the lookout for someone to replace me. I believe that this ministry of presence must be central to the relationship between the American and Congolese Covenant, but I will be 65 in September and it will take a new person four to five years to raise funds, study Lingala and French, become culturally aware, and learn how to listen in a constructive way. Can you help? We need to begin *now*!
