## **Installation of Pastors**

We have been thinking a lot about the Installation of Pastors here at Mission Covenant Church with three of our Pastors assuming new roles in our church. An installation is a formal rite where a pastor is placed into a specific role in a church. This is a public service where the Pastor, or in our case Pastors, receive a charge regarding their tasks within the church. The church itself also publicly declares their intention to receive God's Word as well as leadership within the church from the Pastors while at the same time agreeing to meet the financial needs of the Pastor.

You may be wondering what is the difference between an Ordination Service and an Installation Service. Simply, ordination is the affirmation of a lifetime call to ministry, where the pastor has been examined as meeting the requirements of the ministry through their faith, doctrine, gifting, and conduct. Ordination happens only once in a Pastor's ministry, for me that was June 27, 2003. An installation can happen each time a pastor changes churches or even roles within a church.

It is important for Christians to recognize that we are not only persons, we are also a people. I Peter 2:10a, "Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy." All who have received God's pardon and gift of a new life in Christ become part of a people, God's people. As the Evangelical Covenant Church, we are comprised of local churches that are part of the church worldwide, the church that professes faith in Jesus Christ and believes that the Bible is the Word of God and the only perfect rule for faith, doctrine, and conduct.

In every age of church history, God Almighty has been choosing pastors to proclaim His Word and lead His people. He has been gifting them and calling them as well to ministries in certain communities. Mission Covenant Church has been blessed over the years with thirty Pastors who have served our congregation and community.

Let me mention that one of our very own, Pastor Jenny Armstrong, the daughter of Larry and Gail Williams, will be installed at First Covenant Church, Duluth, MN, on May 5, 2024. We are excited for her as she has been a faithful member of our congregation over the years and interned here as she was completing her Master of Divinity Degree from North Park Seminary. Her installation will take place at their 9:45 a.m. Worship Service with a reception to follow.

Here at MCC we have an installation service planned on May 12 for Pastor Sarah Risley and Pastor Sam Moyer. This will take place at our 9:00 a.m. joint service as we will have no 10:30 a.m. service on that day. We will also have a reception afterwards for our pastors with refreshments and fellowship. Dr. Scott Nelson, the Associate Superintendent of the

Northwest Conference, will preside over the installation and will preach as well. We trust that all of you will be there to support our pastors.

As we look forward to the fall, we will have the Installation for Pastor James Walsh on September 22, 2024, as our new Lead Pastor. This will again happen at the 9:00 a.m. joint service as we will not have the 10:30 a.m. service that day. Reverend Kara Stromberg, the Superintendent of the Northwest Conference will be here to officiate as well as preach the morning message and family members, from out of state, of Pastor James and Heather Walsh will be in attendance. This Sunday will include a reception/refreshment/fellowship time as well.

Installation services are important moments in the life and history of a church. It is a defining moment where we acknowledge that God is building this church, and we are blessed to be a part of that. Please be here on these special days to share in these Blessings!

## **Covenant Park Bible Camp Update**

For the past 4 years I have been able to serve on the Covenant Park Camp Board as a member, and then this past year I was the chair of the board. I wanted to take the time to share a few things that are exciting about camp, some challenges, and vision for the future!

#### **Positives**

- CPBC has been doing incredible ministry for decades! People have sacrificed generously for camp, and we are blessed to have the best facilities in the existence of our camp! Our facilities have brought in \$80-100,000 rental revenue since building the Lakeside Lodge! We are debt free, so that has also helped!
- The board is a fantastic team of movers and shakers who love camp. We recently started the process of Camp Vitality, which is the camp version of church revitalization. We are assessing everything from staffing, to campers, to programs/facilities/finances and more.
- The Lake Superior District Churches have been putting in some extra effort to try and build up camp through leadership, projects, fundraising, and also the passing of our new constitution!
- Campers are coming to Christ; there is a great atmosphere and excitement at camp!
- Our camp director, Kaela Stano, is doing a fantastic job leading camp!

#### **Challenges**

- Some of the challenges we face is a declining number of campers. Part of our work as a board in the revitalization process is to discover the reasons why this is happening. We believe much of this is due to inflation since covid, but there are many other factors outside of our control and even changes within the Lake Superior District churches. As a board we believe the program itself is very well done, so all the youth are coming away with a great experience and improvements are being made each year!

- Financially we are stable because of the rental groups, but our ability to compensate staff is falling behind in our world of inflation. One of the goals for the camp board is to figure out what revenue we need to bring in to thrive as a camp vs. just surviving. It is difficult to attract summer staff to come and work 100-hour weeks for \$200 (50 cents an hour). Many of the staff have to take on part-time jobs to afford working at camp. We have part-time year-round staff that we are having difficulty retaining because \$12 an hour doesn't meet their needs, and it is hard to attract new people to fill those positions when they go empty. Kaela has been working as camp director for 8 years now and has not received a single pay increase during that time, so all that too say...we are financially making budget, but it is coming with great sacrifice to our people working at camp, and the burden is starting to weigh on them risking us losing good quality staff. We as a board are digging into the weeds of what we need to do to turn this ship in the right direction!

#### Vision

- We are working hard to attract new campers. Camp has partnered with the All Night Blitz to increase their exposure to the youth in our area.
- Churches are working hard to reduce the cost for campers to come.
- Churches in our district are working on finding ways to help support and fund staff to work at camp for the summer.
- The new constitution allows for us to welcome new Covenant and non-Covenant churches to be owner/member churches. This will open our pool of potential campers. Our camp board is working on a strategy to attract new churches to join.
- As a board we are working on changes to help Kaela by giving her a sabbatical and reassessing her benefits and compensation to take care of her as best as possible.
- We have a staff blessing fund that people have generously given towards to build up a bonus to camp summer staff! Last year our district churches gave \$7000 to be distributed through this fund, and it made a difference for the summer staff.
- We are launching a new funding model where people can become monthly supporters of camp. We are looking for people who want to invest in the mission and future of Covenant Park Bible Camp by giving funds monthly so that we can continue creating a space where friend meets friend, and both meet God. Just imagine the difference it could make for camp if 50 or 100+ people from our 13 Lake Superior District Churches were giving each month to camp? That alone could make the difference in being able pay our staff reasonably and retain them for the future! All that to say, we believe that God wants to do big things through Covenant Park Bible Camp! Though we face difficulties, we realize that now, more than ever, young people need a place they can go to disconnect from the world and technology to develop meaningful friendships with each other and learn about God!

## Shepherd Leadership

"Be shepherds of God's flock that is under your care, watching over them—not because you must, but because you are willing, as God wants you to be; not pursuing dishonest gain, but eager to serve; <sup>3</sup> not lording it over those entrusted to you, but being examples to the flock. <sup>4</sup> And when the Chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the crown of glory that will never fade away." (1 Peter 5:2-4).



Every sheep needs a shepherd. My "literal"

flock of misfit sheep have taught me things about my shepherding role as a pastor that I never learned in seminary. I often joke that God used my four-legged sheep to help prepare me for leading the two-legged.

Pastoral leadership is inseparable from the role of a shepherd. The word "pastor" comes from the Latin word for "shepherd," and an effective Biblical model of Christian leadership is one that models shepherding. The shepherd-leadership model includes aspects of *presence*, *protection*, and *provision*, all which God does for us! We have His presence, He has shown His protection, and He provides all we need. As a shepherd to the flock, I want to reflect these attributes, which reflect God's heart for His people.

Jesus is the Good Shepherd (Jn. 10:11), the Great Shepherd (Heb. 13:20), and the Chief Shepherd (1 Pet. 5:4). He served and was a shepherd not because he had to but because he cared deeply for his flock. Jesus said, "I know my sheep and my sheep know me-<sup>15</sup> just as the Father knows me and I know the Father-and I lay down my life for the sheep. <sup>16</sup> I have other sheep that are not of this sheep pen. I must bring them also. They too will listen to my voice, and there shall be one flock and one shepherd." (John 10:14-16).

I can call out to my sheep from across the field, and they will hear my voice and come running. Sheep will only come and rest if they feel safe in your presence; laying down shows a level of security from the shepherd's protective presence. This is why God calls for leaders who not only lead His people but also shepherd them. Shepherding adds important, intimate aspects that worldly leadership often lacks. Caring for my flock at home has been an intimate, beautiful experience, helping me be a good shepherd to whoever God puts under my care.






