Loving God, Loving Others

We are blessed as a church to have access to two billboards on Highway 2 that are provided by two different families in our church on their properties. As a result, we are able to put up, rent free, messages advertising our church. One for people on the east side of Highway P for travelers heading west, and the other is west of Highway P for people traveling east. On both billboards, we have a picture of our church facilities in the background with a family walking hand in hand toward the church. The message on this marquee is Loving God and Loving Others.

This, by the way, is our theme for 2022 here at Mission Covenant Church. Our Elder Board, through prayer and discussing all the polarization that exists within our culture due to the Covid-19 pandemic, political strife, racial tensions and outright social unrest, felt like we should devote next year to the subject of Biblical Love. In the Old Testament the Israelites were required to recite the (Shema) everyday personally and with their respective families so that it's message would be passed on to their children. Shema is the Hebrew word for hear, which is the first word in this recitation. Deuteronomy 6:4-5, "Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength."

In Matthew 22:36-40 is a passage where the Pharisees sent an expert of the Law to test Jesus regarding the greatest commandment in the Law. Jesus of course responded with quoting the Shema but added in vs. 39 a second command which He said is like it. "Love your neighbor as yourself. All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments."

God's intentions for the church in 2022 are very straight forward. Love God and Love Others. On January 2, 2022 we will be introducing our theme for the year and then will proceed to have three different sermon series about Love throughout the year. One will be through I John, another will be "Love in the book of Proverbs" and another will take a close look at the love chapter, I Corinthians 13. Please do your part to gather with us in worship as we learn better how to Love our God and Love Others.

Spiritual Health

When I was in college, I spent my sophomore year in a student leadership role called the Spiritual Life Director (SLD) in my dorm. My role was to encourage and disciple all the guys in my dorm (25-30 guys) throughout the course of that school year and really focus on helping these peers grow in their understanding and love of Christ and help them be as healthy as possible in their walk with Christ. I had many opportunities to counsel the guys, pray with and encourage them and I enjoyed this role as an SLD.

Staying healthy and our relationship with God go hand in hand. When we neglect our relationship with God, it is often manifest through unhealthy behaviors and traits. Irritable, discontent, jealous, lustful, vengeful, lashing out, exhausted, and anxious are just a few of the signs that your spiritual health may be struggling. Sometimes life slaps us in the face, and we have to find a way to try and navigate the horrible emotions that come as baggage to our circumstances. Other times, it can be a slow fade where nothing dramatic happens but over time our walk with God slips and so does the words we say. Clinical Psychologist Dr. Jordan Peterson says, “we need to treat ourselves as a loaded weapon.” We are capable of doing great harm to others when we are not in a healthy place spiritually. We are dangerously close to taking matters into our own hands everyday of the week but especially when we are spiritually dry, exhausted, and jealous of others.

In Acts 3, Peter and John went to the Temple and healed a man physically disabled since birth. This drew great attention, and so Peter used this as an opportunity to proclaim the gospel to the people. He called out their rejection of Christ and how God raised him from the dead. Peter then makes this powerful statement in verse 19, "Repent therefore, and turn back, that your sins may be blotted out, that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord". Peter is speaking to an unbelieving audience to persuade them of the gospel, but he is mostly calling out their rejection of Christ, yet there is a positive result for those that repent and turn to the Messiah! Those who do, will have refreshment for their soul because of the presence of the Lord! The word used for refreshing (anapsyxis) is only used twice in the Bible, and in one reference it describes the relief that came to Egypt after the plague of frogs ended. It's basic meaning is refreshment like that of a cool breeze. Jesus ushered in an era of refreshment that comes from the presence of God! Jesus told us in John 7:38 that “rivers of living water will flow from within them” who believe in him.

All this to say, the presence of God within us changes everything! We can experience those times of refreshing that Paul describes, and it is good of us to not neglect that gift! So maybe for you, your spiritual health has been on the back burner and you are seeing the signs of it in your life through the lash outs and discontentment. Take this week and refocus your attention to seeking the Lord and be refreshed by the cool breeze of his presence!



January 2022: The let's grow through reading edition

Associate Pastor Search Committee Update

“...but those who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength,
they shall mount up with wings like eagles,
they shall run and not be weary,
they shall walk and not faint.” Isaiah 40:31 (NRSV)

I recently shared this passage with the Search Committee as we talked about how we see the Holy Spirit at work in our lives and at Mission Covenant Church. As eagles must wait for the uplift of warm rising air to soar, we must wait on the Holy Spirit to direct and carry us onward. And like eagles, it is not our own effort and strength that will carry us high and far, but the power of the breath of the Spirit. As a committee, as individuals, and as a church family, we have collectively been in a season of waiting. Throughout the pastoral search process, the Search Committee has been asking for discernment and wisdom from the Holy Spirit. We have been encouraged to see clear direction and unity on the committee.

We are currently pursuing a candidate we feel is called to pastor at Mission Covenant Church. The committee reached a decision to extend an offer to this candidate in the late part of December. As the discernment process for seeking a pastor goes both ways, we are also in prayer as the candidate seeks God’s direction and listens for confirmation of a call to our congregation.

Our next steps include contacting references, conducting a background check, and following up with any remaining questions between respective parties. We also plan to extend an invitation for the candidate and their family to share a meal with our church staff prior to extending an offer to candidate at our church.

For all those who have been praying through this process: thank you! And keep praying!


